Charlotte "Lynde" Lyndelle Roberts May 25, 1947 – October 29, 2024

Charlotte Lyndelle Roberts, affectionately known as Lynde, beloved mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, wife and friend, passed away peacefully on October 29, 2024, after a long battle with cancer, at the age of 77. Born on May 25, 1947, the majority of her life was spent in Portland, Oregon, where she created a rich tapestry of memories and connections that defined her remarkable journey.
